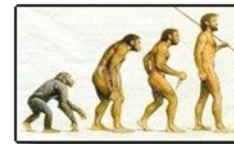


# Valley-Dynamo charts the evolution of the cue ball



## PREHISTORY

**– THE OVERSIZED BALL**  
Before Valley discovered the magnetic cue ball, the oversized 2<sup>3</sup>/<sub>8</sub>” cue ball was the way to go. Nobody really liked a ball larger than the object balls, but there was nothing better until...

The CAT’S EYE CUE BALL arrived in the mid 1960’s. Same size as the object balls, but weighed **8oz** due to the amount of metal!! Also, the metal could have been better balanced, so the ball sometimes had a weeble effect.

**THE ‘SPRING’ BALL** arrived next. It had a *little* less metal, weighed a *little* less and was a little better, but still didn’t center well and sometimes it even separated. An interim step. We could do a *little* better

**TODAY’S COUGAR CUE BALL’S** unique triple-step construction makes it the same weight as the object balls, with enough metal to separate consistently, and still perfectly balanced. Accept nothing less..

Competitors may say “Don’t use those Valley-Dynamo tables that need **HEAVY** cue balls, ours use a *REAL* cue ball.” **NOT TRUE!!!** Valley-Dynamo’s Cougar Cue Ball is **REAL**, it’s **NOT** weighted, and it’s **BALANCED**. Don’t buy their hype!  
(plus, Valley tables never used a Weighted ball separator. Older magnetic balls happened to be heavier... but that’s **IN THE PAST**)
